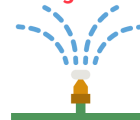
WATERING SCHEDULE

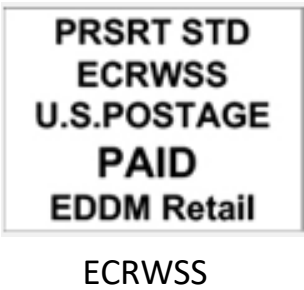
