WHAT IS THE "USE TAX" FOR BUILDING PERMITS?

The Building Materials Use Tax is assessed on anyone who is performing construction work which requires a building permit. This tax is estimated and paid prior to the issuance of the building permit. Building Materials "Use Tax " is calculated based on the total cost of the project building materials, Building materials are defined as materials that become permanently affixed to the building and include bricks, concrete, glass, steel, stone, and lumber.

2021Bond for 3rd-6th Grade Elementary School and three classroom addition to the Pre-school

As everyone is aware the Town of Wiggins has grown exponentially since the citizens of Wiggins passed a bond for a new Middle/High School in 2016.

Since the 2016 bond passed, nearly 500 homes have been built within the Wiggins School District boundaries, inclusive of those built throughout the county. When we went to bond in 2016, the school district had an enrollment of 558 students PreK-12th grade. Fast forward five years since the bond passed, enrollment has increased by 266 (and counting) additional students.

This growth has led to the district surpassing capacity at the preschool and nearing capacity at the elementary school. Capacity in the elementary school sits at 440 students, currently there are 411 students filling these classrooms. Due to enrollment numbers the district has no other option but to bond for a new 3rd-6th grade building to house all of our kids.

Please Join the Building for our Futures Committee at the **Fire Hall** on **September 15th at 7:00 p.m.** to hear about the district's needs for a new building and learn about the limited tax impact this will have on your household.

On **Oct 7th at 7:00 p.m**. Building for our Futures will be hosting a building review meeting in the **Secondary Auditorium** to discuss building options, needs, and gain insight from all Wiggins residents.

There will be a final Building for our Futures question and answer session on **October 20th** in the **Secondary Auditorium at 7:00 p.m.** to help you be educated on all of the facts before you submit your ballot in regards to this bond issue. - Trent Kerr
